Design the computing infrastructures for a new research institute.

The Heritage Laboratory (LaPa) at the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC) is a group of over 50 people who, for the last fifteen years, have been conducting basic and applied research on theory and methodologies for the management of cultural heritage, as well as developing technologies that make this possible. Archaeologists, soil scientists, architects, historians, engineers, anthropologists and computer scientists concur in the same group, adding up to a highly multidisciplinary environment where each project is a new challenge.

LaPa is currently seeking top candidates to design and deploy the new computing infrastructures of the laboratory. The major specialisation areas are TCP/IP networking, Microsoft Windows Server and Active Directory environments, and systems integration. LaPa is growing at a 15% average annual rate, and it is expected to double its staff and work space resources within the next five years. The laboratory's computing infrastructures must be totally redesigned in 2010.

The best applicant will be offered a one-year position, extensible under negotiation and depending on achieved results. The salary will vary depending on the applicant's skills and qualifications, and may be over 27,000 € per annum. The work location will be the *Instituto de Estudios Gallegos Padre Sarmiento*, in Santiago de Compostela, Spain.
